



## State Waiver Process

The Lieutenant Governor's Office on Aging (LGOA) has one (1) waiver form. This State Waiver Form can be used if a Planning and Service Area (PSA) determines that there may be extenuating circumstances regionally which result in the PSA asking to waive established LGOA policies and procedures. Waivers must be in accordance with the Older American Act (OAA).

The LGOA State Waiver Form can be found in the PSA Resource Section of the LGOA website. All Approved State Waivers will be listed on the LGOA website, per Section 210 of the South Carolina Aging Network's Policies and Procedures Manual regarding State Waivers.
